

ATTENTION TEXAS DELTA-8 CUSTOMERS

In Texas, possession of Delta-8 or any THC isomer, like THCO, THCP, or THCV is punishable up to a felony offense, with penalties up to **two years in prison and a \$10,000 fine**. The only exception are hemp products that have been tested and shown to have 0.3% delta-9 THC concentration or less **with no other detectable THC**.

In the past 90 days, at least six delta-8 arrests have occurred in Texas. In all cases, the defendants face felony possession charges. One arrest covered in the news happened in Bryan, TX, on Oct. 2, 2021.

Delta-8 and other isomers are made illegal by the definition of “tetrahydrocannabinol” and “marihuana extract” in Texas’ Controlled Substances List.

On Oct. 11, 2021, the Texas Department of State Health Services, which regulates all CBD retail licenses in Texas, released this written statement (emphasis added): "*Per HSC 481.032 all other forms of THC, including Delta-8 in any concentration and Delta-9 exceeding 0.3%, are considered Schedule I controlled substances. Sale and possession of these products currently constitutes a criminal offense in Texas.*"

If you are stopped and searched by law enforcement and they find delta-8 on your person, you too **risk being arrested and prosecuted with a felony**. Possession of THC extract **of any kind** is an **automatic felony** in Texas.

We care about your safety and security. Because the authority over our license has stated Delta-8 products are currently illegal, we can no longer sell these products. We apologize for this inconvenience.
